VIRTUAL COURSE ON HERBAL MEDICINES AS SUPPORTIVE THERAPIES FOR COVID-19 IN VARIOUS COUNTRIES

INTRODUCTION

The covid-19 pandemic has been creating continuous discussions and debates on the treatments since its first emergence earlier last year. Despite some vaccines have been successfully developed and will be available soon on the market, yet many countries and individuals are still using herbal medicines for covid-19 as alternative and supportive treatment. The fact that no specific treatment for covid-19 is now yet available leading many people in the community and researchers across countries trying to find the treatments including herbal medicines. Since the immune status of the patients plays an important role in covid-19 infection, the use of herbal medicine is of relevance especially those that have potential immunomodulatory effects. However, herbal medicines used may differ in each country as it is normally established based on the local cultures, empirically. Therefore Faculty of Pharmacy Universitas Ahmad Dahlan initiates a virtual course and invites several speakers from its partner institutions to come and give a plenary lecture to address this topic. This course aims to discuss the use of herbal medicines as supportive therapies for covid-19 in various countries. Specifically, during the lecture each speaker would share and highlight about the type of herbal medicines used in the clinical practice for covid-19 in their own country. The lecture will be conducted virtually via Zoom.

In addition, this virtual course also includes a lecture about comorbid in covid-19 and the use of mannequin as virtual patient for learning about comorbid in a patient with covid-19 infection. Also, this course accommodates a meeting between students from participated institutions to get together and share about their current researches one another in a mini colloquium. Eventually, there will be a social project about public awareness campaign of covid-19 that involves the students participating in this course at the end of the event. See below for further details.

1. WORKSHOP ON VIRTUAL MANNEQUIN

Description: A workshop on “Mannequin as a Virtual Patient for Learning of Covid-19 Comorbid” is a part of this virtual course. 2. MINI COLLOQUIUM

- **Name of event:** Mini-colloquium
- **Aim of event:** to give international exposure to students through a scientific meeting attended by students from various countries
- **Participants:** This mini colloquium is designed for students (graduate and undergraduate)
- **Topics:** The topics are not limited to the Corona Virus issues only. The participant is allowed to select any of following topics:
 - Pharmaceutics and pharmaceutical technology
 - Clinical pharmacy
 - Medicinal chemistry
 - Pharmaceutical chemistry
 - Pharmaceutical biology
 - Phytochemistry
 - Pharmacology and toxicology
 - Pharmacokinetics - biopharmaceutics
- **Practicality:**
 1. This colloquium is opened to any undergraduate and post-graduate students of pharmacy
 2. The summary of the project that will be presented should be sent to the committee at least 5 (five) days before the event.
 3. The committee will select students who make it to give talk on his/her research
 4. Time for per presentation is 10 minutes including Q&A and comments from other participants.

3. SOCIAL PROJECT (PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGN OF COVID-19)
